

Note: The following does not include grants made through our fourth portfolio (“Tools”), grants in the form of nonprofit memberships, or grants to nonprofit organizations that serve in consultant capacities. FY2020 was a transition year for our strategic plan and a year when we significantly increased our spending/payout of grants, in response to the COVID-19 crisis, racial justice movements, and needs of key networks. In 2021, our trustees approved two long-term priorities for each of our main grant portfolios. For grant portfolio I: Environmental Justice & Protection, they approved (1) water and (2) climate/energy. For grant portfolio II: Social Justice, they approved (1) voting rights and (2) criminal justice.
