#### **Process & Deadlines**

Letters of Connection (LOCs) are the **first of two phases in our grantmaking process**. They help us start conversations. We value each LOC shared with us, yet given our finite resources, we anticipate more eligible and promising LOCs than we can fund. Therefore, we review every LOC, contact some to learn more, and invite few to submit grant applications (**phase two**). Annually, organizations can submit one or more LOCs for either grant portfolio, and the same LOC form applies to both of our main grant portfolios.

- Grant Porfolio I: Environmental Justice & Protection LOCs due: January 15.
- Grant Portfolio II: Social Justice LOCs due: July 15.

#### **Priorities**

Our grant portfolios each have 2 priority areas.

- Grant Portfolio I: Environmental Justice & Protection (1) water and (2) climate/energy.
- Grant Portfolio II: Social Justice (1) voting rights and (2) criminal justice.
